

**CITY OF COLUMBIA, ILLINOIS
ORDINANCE NO. 3450**

**AN ORDINANCE REVISING PARKING REGULATIONS FOR CERTAIN VEHICLES
WITHIN RESIDENTIAL AREAS**

WHEREAS, the City of Columbia ("City"), Monroe and St. Clair Counties, Illinois is a duly created, organized and validly existing municipality of the State of Illinois under the 1970 Illinois Constitution and the laws of the State of Illinois, including particularly the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto; and

WHEREAS, the City has the authority to regulate parking on public streets within the City's corporate limits; and

WHEREAS, the City finds it is necessary to revise certain requirements of its Parking Code pertaining to on-street parking within residential areas.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Columbia, as follows:

Section 1. That the preceding recitations in the upper part of this Ordinance are realleged, restated and adopted as paragraph one ("1") of this Ordinance.

Section 2. That Section 10.36.010.B of the City's Revised Code of Ordinances ("City Code") shall be deleted in its entirety, and the following inserted in its place:

- B. Vehicles exceeding 25 feet in length or 10,000 lbs. gross vehicle weight rating shall be prohibited from parking on public streets within residential zoning districts or adjacent to residential land uses, except as follows.
1. Such vehicles may be parked in a public right-of-way for no longer than one hour while in the process of loading or unloading.
 2. A commercial, business, or industrial vehicle, as defined in Section 17.04.030 of the City's Zoning Code, may be parked in a public right-of-way within one block of an address where it is actively being used to conduct business.
 3. Heavy construction/excavation equipment may be parked in a public right-of-way within one block of an address where it is actively being used for construction work. Such parking shall not include storage during non-working hours.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take full force and effect immediately upon passage by the Corporate Authorities.

Alderman Ebersohl moved the adoption of the above and foregoing Ordinance; the motion was seconded by Alderman Agne, and the roll call vote was as follows:


