

The City of Columbia, in conjunction with Monroe County, the Village of Valmeyer and the City of Waterloo will host the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency at the Monroe County Fairgrounds for a Household Hazardous Waste One Day Collection from 8 a.m. until 3 p.m. on Saturday, May 22. The collection event is for personal household hazardous waste only. Business, farm, industrial and municipality waste is not allowed. Spring Tree Limb Removal

Spring tree limb removal will take place the week of April 5 – 9. Please place all tree limbs out for removal close to the curb before 6 a.m. on Monday, April 5. One trip will be made throughout the city, eliminating the need to backtrack to certain areas.

Instructions for removal:

- Tree limbs should be 8" or less in diameter
- No whole trees, roots, grass clippings or yard waste
- Only limbs from tree trimming and pruning allowed
- Place limbs in front of residence close to the curb. Do not place limbs in the street, on the sidewalk, or in the alley.
- Do not park vehicles in front of the tree limbs



Quarry Road Resurfacing Project

Phase 1



The Quarry Road Resurfacing Phase 1 project will consist of the resurfacing of Quarry Road from Ghent Road to approximately 400 feet west of Palmer Creek Drive. The project also includes patching, replacing existing culverts

at Palmer Creek, and a shared use path on the south side of Quarry Road. Quarry Road will be closed at times to facilitate construction. During closures, residents and motorists should use alternate routes such as Rueck, Ghent, etc. Palmer Road will

be signed as a one way street from Rueck Road to Palmer Drive. As always your cooperation and patience is greatly appreciated as the roadway improvement project is performed. Expected completion date is set for May, 2021.

Yard Waste Collection Resumes

Each year, yard waste collection begins the first Tuesday in March and continues every Tuesday through the last week of November. Collection will resume this year on March 2.

Yard waste must be set out by 6 a.m. Brown landscape waste paper bags require one yellow Reliable Sanitation waste sticker per bag. Stickers may be purchased at Ace Hardware or City Hall.


