

Carl Street Bridge Reconstruction Project

The much-anticipated Carl Street Bridge Reconstruction Project is set to kick off in the first week of November, promising to enhance our community's infrastructure and improve connectivity. Awarded to Baxmeyer Construction, Inc., this vital project will not only reconstruct the existing bridge but also modernize City utilities attached to it. Weather permitting, the project is expected to span approximately 6 to 8 weeks.

During this period, Carl Street will be closed between IL-3 and Charlotte Avenue to ensure the safety of both workers and motorists. Residents and drivers are encouraged to remain vigilant and attentive to detour signs and lane closures as the construction progresses. Your cooperation and patience during this time are invaluable and greatly appreciated. This project marks a significant investment in our community's future, paving the way for smoother travel and enhanced infrastructure. Stay tuned for updates as the project progresses.

Keeping Our Streets Safe in the Cold

As winter weather approaches, we would like to encourage everyone to take extra precautions while driving. As always, avoid distracted driving and the use of all electronic devices; stay focused, and be aware of your surroundings. Here are a few safety tips :



- Speed limits are based on normal road conditions. Reduce speed on icy or snowy roads.
- Use vehicle headlights during snow, sleet and rain.
- Be cautious of "black ice", which can develop at night on roads and cause sudden loss of control.
- Educate yourself on safe maneuvering techniques for icy conditions.
- Maintain at least three times the normal following distance on snow and ice.
- Stay at least 200 feet back from snow plows.
- Exercise caution bridges, ramps and overpasses, as they freeze first.
- Ensure tires are in good condition, as they are your only contact with the road.

City Prepares for Winter Weather

With winter upon us, the Department of Public Works asks residents to help ensure safe and efficient snow removal by following these guidelines:

- When snow is forecast, please remove vehicles from streets, if possible.
- Avoid placing basketball goals or other obstructions in or near the street.
- Do not push or throw snow from driveways and sidewalks in to the street.
- During heavy snowfall, primary streets will be cleared first. Secondary and subdivision streets will be addressed as snow removal continues, and cul-de-sacs will be cleared last.
- Property owners are responsible for cleaning their driveway approaches and mailboxes.



Fall Leaf & Limb Pickup

As the leaves begin to fall, the Department of Public Works will conduct leaf collection sweeps throughout the city starting November 12 and continuing through December 20. Please have your piles ready by 6 a.m. Residents are reminded of the following guidelines:

- No grass clippings, shrubs, branches, gumballs or limbs permitted.
- Leaves should be placed within four feet of the street, behind the curb and sidewalk, in rows not piles.
- Do not park vehicles in front of the leaves.

Hometown Heroes Banner Project

Thanksgiving - Friday trash pickup will be Saturday November 30th.

Switching to E-Bill and E-Pay ensures your payments are processed efficiently (and on time)!
