News from Columbia School District



Greetings from Columbia Unit School District! The school district works hard to offer the best educational opportunities for the students of Columbia and thanks all community members for their continued support of our initiatives. The following are highlights from the 2010-2011 school year:

- Congratulations to the 143 students who graduated from Columbia High School on May 22nd and to valedictorian Emily Brutton and salutatorian Lainie Ungerer. Best of luck, Class of 2011 graduates!
- The school district opened the doors at the newly renovated Eagleview Elementary on Rapp St. for our preschool students through Grade 1. The parents, students, and faculty love the new facelift and revitalization of downtown Columbia. The learning environment is refreshing!
- Eagleview Elementary has a new principal for the 2011-2012 school year. Mr. Brad Landgraf, the former Assistant Principal of Parkview and Eagleview, has been named as principal of Eagleview. Dr. Beczkala will continue to be principal of Parkview School.
- Parkview School was recognized by the Illinois State Board of Education for receiving the Academic Excellence Award, 2010 Illinois Honor Roll for Schools. This award was based on three solid years of meeting and exceeding state standards at a 90% or above level. Great job to all!
- Due to funding from the Whitey Herzog Foundation, individual contributors, and business donations, the school district was able to construct a new baseball facility and upgrade the softball field behind Eagleview. For the first time in history, the school district has its own baseball field, thanks to community members and business support.

At Columbia High School, the Student Council received a prestigious national award called 2011 National Gold Council of Excellence. Only 159 student councils across the country received this award with only three schools in Illinois. The varsity cheerleading squad earned two state championships (IHSA and ICCA) for two consecutive years which has never before been achieved. The varsity boys' soccer team also finished 3rd at the state tournament which is also the highest level reached in school history.

CUSD #4 KINDERGARTEN AND NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION. Columbia School District is currently registering all kindergarten students and any new students who have moved into the district for the 2011-2012 school year. Parents of kindergarten and new students are asked to not wait for the annual district wide Student Registration scheduled for July 26, 27, and 28. It is important to obtain enrollment projections sooner than later for staff assignments. Please contact the respective school (Eagleview K-1; Parkview 2-4; Columbia Middle School 5-8, and Columbia High School 9-12) to obtain registration information.

Summertime Safety For Children From the Columbia Police Department

Summertime is here! One of the most common sights around the City of Columbia during the summer months is children riding bikes, skateboards, and rollerblading. The Columbia Police Department would like to remind everyone to use caution when riding anything with wheels and remind everyone to respect other people's property and not ride where it is posted or prohibited. It is our goal to reduce the number of injuries to children in our community by encouraging them to wear helmets anytime they ride anything with wheels on it.

With the assistance of local pediatrician Dr. Joe Cangas and his Helmets First organization, the officers of the Columbia Police Department will be looking for children riding bikes and wearing their helmets. When officers locate these children they will give them a reward from Dr. Cangas and Helmets First. The rewards include baseball or football tickets, amusement parks tickets, as well as free food and desserts from local businesses in Columbia. BUDGET INFORMATION

On April 18 the City of Columbia passed a budget for the upcoming fiscal year of a little less than \$14.2 million.

As part of the budget process the City establishes the fee ordinance. Understanding that these are hard economic times for everyone, the only fee that will increase this year is the trash collection fee which increases by \$.35 with your first bill in May. This fee is only increased by the amount of increase from the vendor. (Sanitary Sewer connections increase by 2% every year per City Code.) The City also decreased the returned check fee from \$30.00 to \$10.00.

UTILITY BILL PAYMENTS

For your convenience, utility bill payments & other city correspondence/payments (**no cash please**) may be placed in our drive-up utility box any time of the day/night. The box is located in front of City Hall in the parking lot.

Please enter from the Cedar Street side. The box is emptied daily.

IT'S ROAD CONSTRUCTION SEASON

Kunz Street between Legion and Main Street is currently under construction. Access is limited to local traffic only until the pavement has been constructed. Concrete work on Milton Street from Rapp to the dead end will begin soon. Watch for barricades and closures where work is taking place. The intersection improvement of South Main and Illinois Route 3 will be on the IDOT June letting with construction taking place in the late summer into fall. The Main Street Streetscape project between Cherry and Cedar will be on the IDOT August letting with construction taking place in fall. Please watch for detours, lane or street closures and most of all workers on the roadway. Thank you for your understanding and patience as the roadway improvements take place.
