EXPLORE COLUMBIA!

The City of Columbia, in partnership with HeartLands Conservancy, has begun the process of creating the Explore Columbia! plan, a comprehensive effort to improve walking and bicycling conditions throughout the city. When completed, this plan will make it easier for people of all ages and abilities to safely and comfortably reach parks, schools, shopping areas, and other important community destinations on foot, by bike, or through other alternatives for transportation. The plan will detail locations and conditions of sidewalks, multi-use trails, bike lanes, and other routes and it will allow the City to apply for funding to complete these projects.


City leaders, working through the Play Commission, need citizens' help in order to determine the most appropriate locations and types of facilities, and desired walking and/or biking improvements to be incorporated into the plan document. Throughout the planning process there will be several opportunities for citizens to give their feedback, ideas, and concerns about Explore Columbia! The first of these is a survey available online at <https://www.surveymonkey.com/s/ExploreColumbia>; paper copies can also be picked up in the Clerk's Office at Columbia City Hall.

On Tuesday, June 26th, an Explore Columbia! Open House will be held from 5:00-7:00 p.m. at City Hall. At this open house, attendees will be asked to identify destinations, barriers, and corridors for walking and biking travel in Columbia. City officials, Play Commission members, and planners will be available to answer any questions. All information gathered from participants will then be used to help create the final plan.

Other events that will take place as part of the planning process include a Walking Event and a second Open House to review draft plan recommendations. Dates have not yet been set for either activity.

This project is funded by a federal planning grant administered through the Illinois Department of Transportation; other partners include Trailnet and James Pona & Associates. In all, four Metro East communities are participating in this pilot project--Swansea, Waterloo, Columbia, and a yet to be determined Madison County community.

SOUTH MAIN STREET AND ILLINOIS ROUTE 3

On April 2, 2012 South Main Street at Illinois Route 3 was closed to traffic for construction. On Thursday, April 26, 2012 South Main Street was reopened to traffic for a total closure of a mere 25 days. The contract allowed for a maximum of 70 days of closure meaning only 36% of the closure time was utilized. The City wants to give thanks and appreciation to Baxmeyer Construction for getting the project accomplished in an efficient and timely manner. Tim Ahrens, Assistant City Engineer, was more than willing to meet Baxmeyer Construction's schedule and work through issues while adhering to the plans and specifications. The City also wants to thank the businesses and property owners in the area as well as the traveling public for their understanding and patience while the construction took place.

News from Columbia School District



Columbia Unit School District #4 is proud to be the recipient of four prestigious awards that recognize accomplishments in academics, energy savings, and per pupil expenditures. Parkview School (second year in a row) and Columbia Middle School received the Academic Excellence Award from the Illinois State Board of Education for consistently having high ISAT scores in reading and math. In addition, the school district received the Bright Star Award which compares the cost of educating a student and ISAT scores. CUSD4 received the award for being well below the state average for cost per pupil, but above the state average for our reading and math scores in Grades 3-8. Lastly, the district eagerly accepted the Energy Star Award for Eagleview Elementary's energy efficient geothermal heating and cooling system. Out of over 4000 schools in Illinois, Eagleview was named one of one hundred schools which received this award across the state.

Other school district news:

- The school district congratulates Dr. Roger Chamberlain (CMS principal) and Mrs. Deb Sisk (CHS English) who are two educators retiring from CUSD4 this year. Both individuals have touched the lives of many students, and we wish them the best of luck!
- Replacing the existing football field, the multi-purpose turf field will be installed this summer with an early August completion date. The field surface will allow for continual use by CMS and CHS students during the school day and for after school activities - football, soccer, track, and more. A capital campaign to raise funds for the project is underway. Please visit the district's website for more information on the project, the in-kind donations, and the fundraising efforts.
- For the first time in over twenty years, Columbia High School will offer FFA classes and have an after school FFA/Agriscience Club during the 2012-2013 school year. A special thank you to the Columbia Agriscience Association (FFA Chapter Alumni) for providing support for the new high school program.

All parents will need to register their student for the 2012-2013 school year. Entering kindergarten students should register at Eagleview as soon as possible. District wide Student Registration dates are July 25, July 26, and July 30. Student registration information and paperwork can be accessed on the district's website. Parents can copy and complete in advance. All parents must show one proof of residency (utility bill – water, gas, electric) when registering to verify continued residency within CUSD4 boundaries. A Message from the Columbia Police Department



Throughout the year there are a number of scams that criminals use to try and take money from innocent and unsuspecting victims. Unfortunately, the City of Columbia is starting to see an increase in these types of crimes. I would like to take this opportunity to provide pertinent information regarding scams so that individuals may protect themselves from these types of crimes.

The majority of scams are done by: Mail - E-mail - Phone

Mail scams are usually letters that request all of your contact and/or personal information be sent to someone. The letter will often state that they have millions of dollars in a foreign bank account and they want to work with you to send the money to America. In exchange for your assistance, they will guarantee the recipient of the letter millions of dollars.

E-mail scams typically come with a subject line titled "ALERT" or "Unpaid Account." The message will commonly start out by saying, "I have been waiting for you to contact me since..." or "I have been unable to contact you and this is your final notice." The sender of the e-mail will request the recipient send a specific amount of money and in return they will send them something for their cooperation. The body of the message will usually contain broken English and may include an address from another country. Currently the most common scams are lottery type scams from Canada.

Phone scams frequently involve an unidentified person calling and demanding you to give the caller confidential information. They will often claim they are a credit card company or a debt collection agency.

Please do not ever give or send personal information or money to people or places unfamiliar to you. I would encourage everyone to delete any e-mails they receive if they do not know the e-mail sender. If someone calls you on the phone and you do not know who they are, simply end the conversation by hanging up the phone.

Please note that the situations previously mentioned are just a few of the scams that are currently being used. We ask that you remember to never give out your personal information over the phone or through the mail to people or companies that are unfamiliar to you. BUDGET INFORMATION

On April 16th the City of Columbia passed a budget for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2012 that is a little less than \$14.2 million. The previous year's budget was a little less than \$14.2 million and the increase in the overall budget is less than 1/2 of 1 per cent. The budget for the year beginning May 1, 2012 and ending April 30, 2013 may be viewed at the city website www.columbiaillinois.com under City Government and then Budget Document. Also under City Government is the required posting pursuant to P.A. 97-609 effective 1-1-12 which lists employees who receive over \$75,000 in compensation which includes salary and certain benefits. 
UTILITY BILL PAYMENTS
