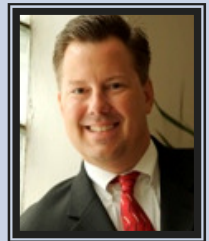

## HISTORIC MAIN ST. STREETScape- PHASE 2

The City of Columbia has been awarded approximately \$1,000,000 from an Illinois Department of Transportation Enhancement Grant to complete Phase 2 of the Main Street Streetscape Project. The project includes the removal and replacement of deteriorated sidewalks, the construction of ADA compliant intersection curb ramps, ornamental street lights and signs, and the addition of trees from Whiteside Street to Oak Street. The project is consistent with the City of Columbia's Master Plan to, "achieve the preservation and enhancement of Main Street as a vibrant commercial and historical center of the City with a variety of activities and a selection of goods and services where people can walk, ride bicycles or drive to take advantage of these amenities." Design of the project should begin in 2017 with construction in late 2018. ## OUTSTANDING LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The East-West Gateway Council of Governments presented an Outstanding Local Government Achievement Award to the Kaskaskia Cahokia Trail on November 10 during its 51st annual meeting, recognizing area governments and officials for the achievement in the areas of public service, leadership and productive collaboration among local governments. The City of Columbia works in partnership with leaders of St. Clair County, Randolph County and Monroe County to research, preserve and promote the historic Kaskaskia-Cahokia Trail, which was designated a State Historic and Scenic Route in 2014. ### Columbia Police Drug “Take-Back” A Continued Success

In July of 2012, the Columbia Police Department placed a container donated by the Illinois American Water Company and Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) in the lobby of our police department to “Take-Back” medication.

The goal of the prescription drug take-back program is to make it easier for the public to drop off unused, out of date, or unwanted prescription drugs and keep them from unintended use.” This also keeps people from flushing harmful medication into our water system.

To date we have collected and incinerated 1,524 pounds of drugs from the Columbia Police take-back box.

No forms or additional information is required and the disposal box is easily accessible for drop-offs in the lobby of the Columbia Police Department.

##### **Restricted Gifts**

You may have an interest in an area of the City and choose to give a restricted or designated gift whos purpose is to strengthen a particular program, department or capital need. A restricted gift, if approved by the City Council, is used solely for the projects that you specify.

##### **Unrestricted Gifts**

An unrestricted gift allows the City to address its areas of greatest need. This type of gift provides the most flexibility when distributed. Such gifts may be combined with other funds to permit the City to initiate major institutional goals. Donations may be made any time through checks made out to, “Columbia PLAY Foundation” and gifts are deductible under the Internal Revenue Code

##### **Memorial and Commemorative Gifts**

A thoughtful way to honor a loved one, friend or colleague is through a memorial/commemorative gift. Contributions may be made to any area of the City. The individual being honored or family of the deceased individual will be notified of the contribution and a permanent record of such gift will be maintained in the official records of the City. Items available for contribution include: Memorial bench or table, Welcome Center paver or a Metter Park commemorative brick.

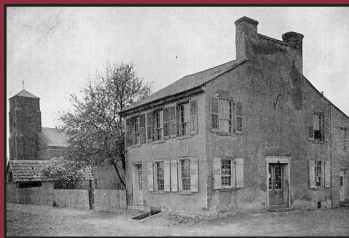

#### THANKSGIVING

Due to the Thanksgiving holiday, the regular Friday (Nov. 25) trash and recycling removal will be on Saturday (Nov. 26).

#### LARGE ITEM TRASH REMOVAL

The next large item curbside trash removal is Tuesday (Nov. 29).

#### CHRISTMAS

Trash removal for Tuesday (Dec. 27) and Friday (Dec. 30): Reliable Sanitation will allow three (3) additional 30 gallon containers / bags of trash in addition to the one (1) trash tote. No extra \$1.00 trash stickers are needed.

#### NEW YEARS

After New Years, Tuesday (Jan. 3) and Friday (Jan. 6) trash & recycling removal has not changed. Extra trash will require the \$1.00 per container trash stickers.

#### LIVE CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING
