Updated Columbia Population — 10,868

Results from the special census conducted over the summer resulted in an increase of 1,161 residents.

Due to the increased number, an estimated \$180,000 to \$190,000 will be received by the City of Columbia each year in additional revenue. The City will receive nearly \$1.7 million annually in state revenue to help fund public services such as street maintenance, police and emergency medical services. While the City spent \$105,000 to conduct the special census, we will net more than \$500,000 in additional revenue over the next several years.

The next decennial census, which counts the entire city population, will be in 2020.

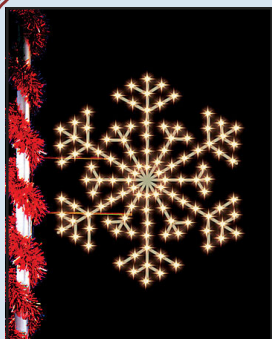

The P.L.A.Y. Foundation is a non profit organization seeking to enhance Columbia's park system while working in conjunction with the City of Columbia. The Foundation accepts donations for restricted, unrestricted and memorial & commemorative gifts.

Restricted Gifts: You may have an interest in an area of the City and choose to give a restricted or designated gift whose purpose is to strengthen a particular program, department or capital need. A restricted gift, if approved by the City Council, is used solely for the projects that you specify.

Unrestricted Gifts: An unrestricted gift allows the City to address its areas of greatest need. This type of gift provides the most flexibility when distributed. Such gifts may be combined with other funds to permit the City to initiate major institutional goals. Donations may be made any time through checks made out to, "P.L.A.Y. Columbia Parks and Recreation Foundation" and gifts are deductible under the Internal Revenue Code.

Memorial and Commemorative Gifts: A thoughtful way to honor a loved one, friend or colleague is through a memorial/commemorative gift. Contributions may be made to any area of the City. The individual being honored or family of the deceased individual will be notified of the contribution and a permanent record of such gift will be maintained in the official records of the City. Items available for contribution include: park benches, picnic tables, trees or commemorative brick pavers.

HOLIDAY TRASH & RECYCLING SCHEDULE



THANKSGIVING: Due to the Thanksgiving holiday, the regular Friday trash and recycling will be on Saturday, November 25.

LARGE ITEM CURBSIDE REMOVAL: The next large item (i.e. appliances, furniture, etc.) curbside removal is Tuesday, November 28. Bags of trash will not be accepted.

CHRISTMAS: Regular Tuesday trash and recycling will be on Wednesday, December 27. Regular Friday trash and recycling will be on Saturday, December 30. Reliable Sanitation will allow three (3) additional 30 gallon containers / bags of trash in addition to the one (1) trash tote. No extra \$1.00 trash stickers are needed.

NEW YEARS: Regular Tuesday trash and recycling will be on Wednesday, January 3. Regular Friday trash and recycling will be on Saturday, January 6. Extra trash will require the \$1.00 per container trash stickers.

LIVE CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING: Live Christmas tree recycling drop off will be held at the Bolm-Schuhkraft City Park parking lot next to the Parkview School on Saturday, January 13, 2018 from 10:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon. Any questions, call the City Clerk's Office at (618) 281-7144 ext. 100.

The last day for curbside leaf removal will be Friday, December 1.
There will be no landscape waste removal during the months of December, January and February.



ADMIRAL WEINEL BOULEVARD PAVEMENT REPLACEMENT PROJECT

The Admiral Weinel pavement replacement project is scheduled to start construction the beginning of November. The existing concrete pavement will be removed and replaced from Illinois Route 3 to Admiral Trost Road. There will be a marked detour route getting vehicular traffic from Illinois 3 to Admiral Weinel Boulevard via Valmeyer Road and Admiral Trost Road. The project is anticipated to last approximately six weeks. As always your cooperation and patience is greatly appreciated as the roadway improvement project is performed.

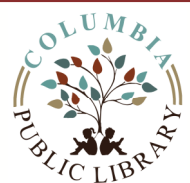
