

ORDINANCE NO. 2482

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL CITY OF COLUMBIA, ILLINOIS ORDINANCE NO. 2437

WHEREAS, the City of Columbia, Illinois (the "City") Ordinance No. 2437 was enacted February 6, 2006 to provide for preservation of historic sites in the City of Columbia, Illinois;

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to change the wording of Section 15.64.030 of Ordinance No. 2437 from the current wording to allow no more than three (3) non resident members of the Commission;

WHEREAS, it is necessary and appropriate that Ordinance No. 2437 be repealed and that a new ordinance be enacted to provide for preservation of historic sites in the City of Columbia, Illinois;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Columbia, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. The recitals contained above in the preamble of this Ordinance are hereby incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth in this Section of this Ordinance verbatim, as findings of the City Council of the City of Columbia, Illinois.

Section 2. The City of Columbia, Illinois Ordinance No. 2437 enacted February 6, 2006, entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR PRESERVATION OF HISTORIC SITES
IN THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, ILLINOIS"

is hereby repealed.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, as provided by law.
